

MGs in the Post from Reinout Vogt



This month, my Dutch friend Karel sent another card from the Dutch MG importer Molenaar in Amersfoort. The MG is a Magnette Mk III, designed by the Italian designer Pininfarina and usually referred to as the "Farina". As the successor of the ZA/ZB Magnettes, it was not very successful in the market because it was more of a 'regular' saloon than a 'sports' sedan. It was the time of badge engineering in the British car industry and within BMC the car was available as an Austin, Wolseley, Riley, and the Morris Oxford, the version which we had for a while. It was slow and heavy and Henneke nicknamed it "The Tank".

On a camping trip in the spring of 1975, while I was changing a flat tire, the jack went right through the rusted sill and miraculously, Henneke just captured that moment on a photo. At the time the car wasn't worth saving and went to the junk yard.





From Under the Bonnett



It's always a joy to learn about a solution to a problem before you encounter it!

That's what happened to Glen Moore and me when we traveled to the home of Rick Sevcech in Yulee, Florida.

Looking at some transmission work he recently completed, we noticed a peculiar 'seal' around the overdrive solenoid. His answer to "where did you get the seal?" was "Liquid Tape". This rubber based brush-on liquid tape forms a protective, waterproof, UV-resistant, dielectric seal around spliced electrical wire to protect against corrosion, shortages, electrical shock and vibration.

Our shop is located in a charming 19th century Victorian house called the Inside-Outside House. The house derives the name from its unique construction. The wall studs are exposed on the exterior with finished walls on the inside. The house was originally built in Boston, Massachusetts in 1870 by Capt. W. Pierce, a sea captain. It is thought to be one of the oldest still standing prefabricated houses in the US. It was disassembled in 1873 and shipped to Jacksonville and then down the St. Johns River by steamship to Sanford. After arriving in Sanford, it was transported by mule cart to Altamonte Springs and reassembled there on Boston Ave. Capt. Pierce used the ground level as a cabinet shop with living quarters upstairs. To prevent demolition in 1973, it was moved to Longwood and restored by the Central Florida Society for Historic Preservation. This unique house, with elaborate wood detailing on the porch is now home to the Cottage Gift Shop and is open to the public Monday-Saturday 10-5 PM (excluding holidays).
